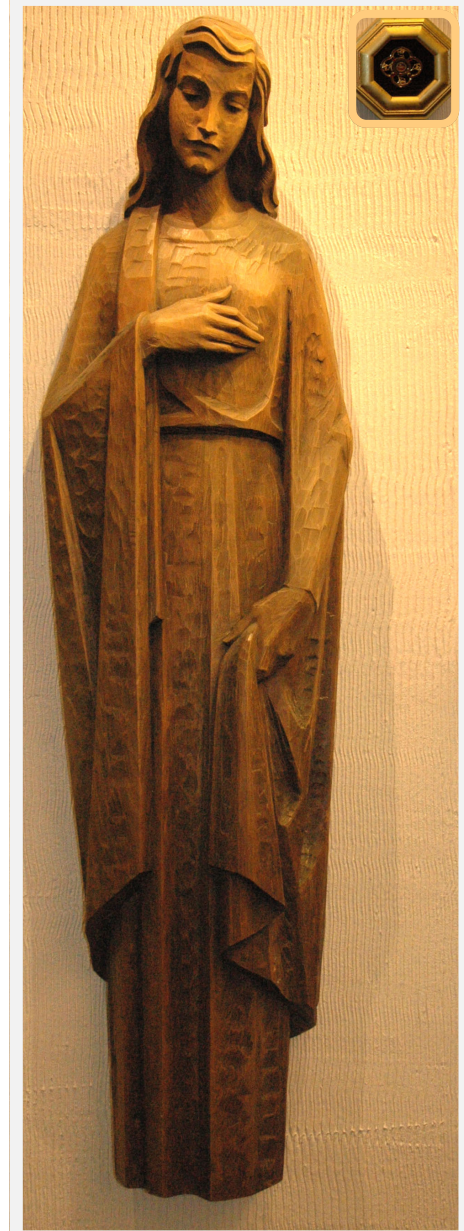

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

Many of us have experienced a mysterious visitor who knocked on our door and wanted to talk about God, holding a Bible under their arm. These visitors are called Jehovah's Witnesses.

Personally, I think their visit is an indictment of our laziness and neglect of two fundamental Christian duties: to know God from the Bible and to evangelize. Many Christians today would not be able to explain the mystery of the Trinity.

A fragment of the Gospel of Matthew is a great example of faith of the first disciples in the Holy Trinity. Baptism is to be granted in the name of God, and not in the names. One name, which is one God, but at the same time Three that are equally important. The whole Trinity performs one action that belongs only to God. Baptism, which is the work of the Trinity, gives us deliverance from sins, sanctifies us, makes us children of God, and these actions are the work of God alone!

When Jesus forgave the sins of a paralyzed man he previously cured, scribes and priests thought: "Why did he say that? That is blasphemy! Who has the authority to forgive sins but God alone?" (Mk 2.7).

The Jews understood what Jesus meant perfectly. "Therefore the Jews sought to kill Him even more so, because He not only broke the sabbath, but also called God his Father, making himself equal with God" (Jn 5:18). Jesus did not deny to the Jews that he is equal to God. He was crucified by the Jews for just that.

It is the same with the Holy Spirit. It is not acting as the "soul of the Father" or "soul of the Son" or an impersonal power, but as an independent person. And yet it is the same one God as the Father and the Son! "But when the Spirit of truth comes, it will teach you all truth" (Jn 16, 13).

Theology says that the Father comes from no one, the Son from the Father through human birth, and the Holy Spirit comes from the Father and the Son. The Holy Spirit, speaks of itself, "I", meaning it is a person, and not some impersonal spiritual breath: "While Peter was pondering on his vision, the Spirit said to him: three men are looking for you. So go down and go with them without hesitation; for I have sent them" (10,19-20). We need not be distinguished experts on dogma, but it is enough for us to know at least as much as we learned today, to not only close the door before the witnesses of the spirit of lies, but to shut their mouths to avoid spreading of the falsified truth!

On behalf of all our parishioners, I congratulate Deacon Jim Schiltz on the 25-th anniversary of his ordination and joining the group of permanent deacons of the Archdiocese of Chicago. I also congratulate both Jim and Connie Schiltz on their 45th anniversary of sacramental marriage. I've known them both for over 27 years. They adopted two daughters and put a lot of love and commitment in their upbringing. They are a great and loving family. They are very involved in parochial life, despite the fact that they live 45 miles away. They overcome this distance 3 or 4 times a week. May the Lord bless them abundantly for many years! We all love you!

Drodzy Parafianie i Przyjaciele,

Zapewne wielu z nas przeżyło odwiedzin tajemniczych gości, którzy pukając do naszych drzwi, chcieli porozmawiać o Bogu, trzymając Biblię pod pachą. Tak, to świadkowie Jehowy. Osobiście myślę, że ich wizyta jest oskarżeniem naszej gnuśności i zaniedbania dwóch podstawowych obowiązków chrześcijańskich: poznania Boga w Biblii i ewangelizowania. Wielu chrześcijan nie potrafiłoby dziś nic powiedzieć o tajemnicy Trójcy Świętej.

Fragment z Ewangelii Mateusza jest wspaniałym świadectwem wiary pierwszych uczniów Jezusa w Trójcę Świętą. Chrzest ma być udzielany w Imię, a nie w imiona. Jedno Imię, czyli jeden Bóg, ale jednocześnie Trzech na tym samym poziomie. Cała Trójca wykonuje działanie, które przynależy tylko Bogu. Chrzest, który jest dziełem Trójcy, daje nam uwolnienie z grzechów, uświęca nas, czyni nas dziećmi Boga, a te czynności są dziełem jedynie Boga!

Gdy Jezus odpuszczał grzechy uzdrowionemu paralitykowi, uczeni w Piśmie, a więc znawcy przedmiotu, pomyśleli: „Czemu On tak mówi? On bluźni. Któż może odpuszczać grzechy, prócz jednego Boga?” (Mk 2,7). Żydzi, doskonale rozumieli, co Jezus chciał przez to powiedzieć. „Dlatego więc usiłowali Żydzi tym bardziej Go zabić, bo nie tylko nie zachowywał szabatu, ale nadto Boga nazywał swoim Ojcem, czyniąc się równym Bogu” (J 5,18). Jezus nie zaprzeczył Żydom, że tak właśnie jest. On naprawdę czynił się równym Bogu, nazywając Go swoim Ojcem! Został przez Żydów oskarżony o bluźnierstwo i ukrzyżowany. Podobnie rzecz się ma z Duchem Świętym. On nie występuje jako jakaś „dusza Ojca” lub „dusza Syna”, czy też bezosobowa moc, tylko jako samodzielna Osoba. A jednak jest tym samym Bogiem, co Ojciec i Syn! „Lecz gdy przyjdzie On, Duch Prawdy, nauczy was wszelkiej prawdy” (J 16, 13).

Teologia mówi, że Ojciec nie pochodzi od nikogo, Syn pochodzi od Ojca przez prawdziwe zrodzenie, Duch od Ojca i Syna. Duch Święty, mówiąc o sobie „Ja”, jest Osobą, a nie jest jakimś bezosobowym duchowym tchnieniem: „Kiedy Piotr rozmyślał jeszcze nad widzeniem, powiedział do niego Duch: Poszukuje cię trzech ludzi. Zejdź więc i idź z nimi bez wahania, bo Ja ich posłałem” (10,19–20). Nie musimy być wybitnymi znawcami dogmatyki, ale wystarczy nam znać choćby tyle, ile dziś poznaliśmy, by nie tylko zamknąć drzwi przed świadkami ducha kłamstwa, ale i zamknąć im usta, by nie fałszowali prawdy!

W imieniu wszystkich naszych parafian gratuluję Diakonowi Jim Schiltz 25-jej rocznicy święceń i dołączenia do grona stałych diakonów Archidiecezji Chicago. Gratuluję Państwu Connie i Dk. Jim Schiltz 45-rocznicy sakramentalnego związku małżeńskiego. Znam ich oboje już ponad 27 lat. Zaadoptowali dwie córki i włożyli wiele miłości i zaangażowania w ich wychowanie. Stanowią wspaniałą kochającą się rodzinę. Są wyjątkowo zaangażowani w życie parafii, mimo tego, że mieszkają w odległości 45 mil. Tę odległość pokonują 3 lub 4 razy tygodniowo. Niech Pan im obficie błogostawi na długie lata! Kochamy was wszyscy!

When Jesus speaks of his identity and mission as service, he says, "For the son of man came not to be served but to **serve** and to give his life as a ransom for the many." (Mark 10:45) With these words, Jesus not only defined the meaning of his own service and that of all his followers, he also defined the service of those who would act in his name and in his person, the priests of his Church.

We often understand serving as doing favors for others or bestowing benefits on them. For Jesus and for those in Holy Orders—his bishops, priests, and deacons—serving goes much farther and much deeper. He defines his service as "giving his life as a ransom for the many," in other words, his self gift in life-giving love for others. In the end, those in Holy Orders are called to a similar service that culminates in the self gift in life-giving love for others in the Eucharistic sacrifice: *This is my body given up for you. This is my blood.*

ON TRINITY SUNDAY, AND BEING MAD (IN A GOOD WAY)

One of my favorite possessions is a gift my daughter gave me several years ago now, and because it has graced the writing desk in my office/den from the get-go, I've seen it nearly every day since. It is an 8" by 8" brown frame which holds a piece of cream-colored parchment paper on which Sarah hand-lettered in green gouache a Latin quote from the Roman lyric poet Horace. It reads: *Aut insanit homo, aut versus facit*, which roughly translates into "The fellow is either mad, or he is composing verse." Any home-made gift is special to me. Because of its writerly context, this one is even more so.

And, it comes to mind on this Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity as I ponder the mystery we're all pondering today. It comes to mind specifically because of something I stumbled upon last week doing a little online research about the Holy Spirit. It was an article written by a guy named Bill Bright, who in turn quoted a Dr. Wilbur Smith, one of Bright's seminary instructors. And per Dr. Smith (per Bill Bright): "The man who denies the Trinity will lose his soul. The man who tries to understand the Trinity will lose his mind." *Aut insanit homo, aut he is studying the Triune God. Or something like that...* In *The Princess Bride*, when Inigo is confused about what to do next, he returns to the place where his boss gave him the current assignment ("I am waiting for you, Vizzini. You told me to go back to the beginning"). Often it's good to return to the beginning--for perspective, if nothing else--and maybe the "beginning" for a better understanding of the Trinity is the Catechism of the Catholic Church. The Catechism offers an overview: "The mystery of the Most Holy Trinity is the central mystery of Christian faith and life. It is the mystery of God in himself. It is therefore the source of all the other mysteries of faith, the light that enlightens them...The whole history of salvation is identical with the history of the way and the means by which the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, reveals himself to men, and (from the General Catechetical Directory) 'reconciles and unites with himself those who turn away from sin.'" Then, the dogma: "The Trinity is one. We do not confess three Gods, but one God in three persons, the 'consubstantial Trinity' (from the Council of Constantinople). The divine persons do not share the one divinity among themselves but each of them is God whole and entire." And (from the Council of Toledo XI): "The Father is that which the Son is, the Son that which the Father is, the Father and the Son that which the Holy Spirit is, i.e., by nature one God" Also, "He is not the Father who is the Son, nor is the Son he who is the Father, nor is the Holy Spirit he who is the Father or the Son..." In his essay, Bright recognizes the inadequacy of human-designed models to illustrate the Trinity ("For example, I could say that a man has a body, a mind and a spirit—which one is the man?"). Which is no better or worse than the three-leaf clover model I learned in grade school. In the end, I believe, but I don't lose any sleep trying to really understand. *Aut insanit homo, aut...*

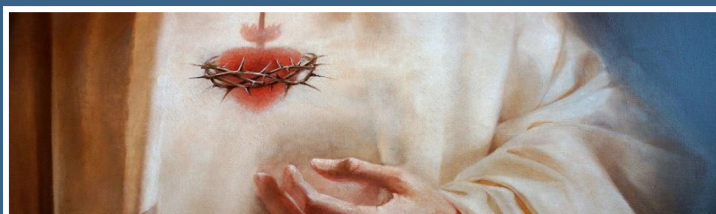

SACRAMENTAL LIFE

Baptisms... We celebrate Baptisms in the English language on the first and third Sundays and in the Polish language on the second and fourth Sundays of each month. Parents must participate in a Baptismal preparation meeting before a date can be scheduled. To register for a meeting call the rectory secretary.

Weddings... The Archdiocese of Chicago requires arrangements for weddings be made four months in advance. We at St. Constance strongly recommend at least six months before the date of marriage. You will need to meet with our deacon / priest before any other arrangements are made. Call the rectory for an appointment.

Sacrament of the Sick... Call the Rectory to make arrangements for a priest. Please do not wait until the person is unconscious or near death.

Communion Calls... If you or someone you love are ill or home bound and would like to receive Communion, call the rectory to make arrangements for regular visits.

ZADANIE MISYJNE PARAFII ŚW. KONSTANCJI

Parafia Św. Konstancji jest modlitewną, opiekuńczą i otwartą na wszystkich wspólnotą Kościoła Rzymsko-Katolickiego. Parafia, która została założona w 1916 r., przez polskich emigrantów, obecnie jest zróżnicowana kulturowo. Jako wspólnota parafialna tak podejmujemy nasze zadania, aby jeszcze lepiej dzielić się naszymi talentami, czasem i dobrami. INFORMACJE O SAKRAMENTACH ŚWIĘTYCH

Chrzty... Sakrament Chrztu Świętego jest udzielany w języku angielskim i polskim. Chrzty w języku angielskim są w pierwszą i trzecią niedzielę, a w języku polskim w drugą i czwartą niedzielę każdego miesiąca. Rodzice są zobowiązani do wzięcia udziału w spotkaniu przygotowującym do tego sakramentu przed planowaną datą chrztu dziecka. Prosimy o skontaktowanie się z biurem parafialnym, aby zgłosić dziecko do chrztu.

Sakrament Małżeństwa... Archidiecezja Chicago zaleca, aby osoby, które planują zawarcie sakramentu małżeństwa zgłosiły się do biura parafialnego co najmniej cztery miesiące przed datą ślubu. Chcielibyśmy i usilnie zalecamy, aby w naszej parafii okres przygotowania trwał sześć miesięcy. Prosimy, abyście najpierw ustalili termin w kościele, a następnie w innych miejscach.
